


WASHINGTON — The Department of Veterans Affairs today announced that women Veterans can now schedule appointments directly with VA gynecology providers without a referral from a primary care provider.

The new, streamlined process takes effect today and eliminates the previous requirement for a PCP referral to access VA gynecology care. Instead, enrolled women Veterans can schedule an appointment directly with a VA gynecology specialist if they choose.

The change will better serve the more than 1 million women Veterans who are enrolled in VA health care.

“This is what it looks like when VA is focused on putting Veterans first,” said **VA Secretary Doug Collins**. “By relentlessly focusing on customer service and convenience, we are building a department that works better for the men and women we are charged with serving.”

Today’s announcement is the latest in a long list of VA accomplishments during the second Trump Administration, including:

- The backlog of Veterans waiting for VA benefits is [down 57%](#) under the second Trump Administration, after increasing 24% during the Biden Administration.
- VA has [eliminated the backlog of Veteran families waiting for VA health care](#).
- VA is [processing record numbers of disability claims](#), reaching an all-time fiscal-year high of [three million claims processed Sept. 30](#).
- VA has opened [20 new health care clinics across the nation](#) since Jan. 20.
- Since Jan. 20, VA has offered Veterans more than 1.4 million appointments outside of normal operating hours. These early-morning, evening and weekend appointments are giving Veterans more timely and convenient options for care.
- VA [permanently housed 51,936 homeless Veterans](#) across the country in fiscal year 2025 – the highest total in seven years.
- VA is spending [an additional \\$800 million](#) on infrastructure improvements to ensure department facilities provide safe and effective patient care.
- VA has made it [easier](#) and [faster](#) for VA-enrolled Veterans to access care from non-VA providers at the department’s expense.
- VA has implemented [major reforms](#) to make it easier for survivors to get benefits, after [serious problems](#) during the Biden Administration.
- VA is [accelerating the deployment](#) of its integrated electronic health record system, after the program was nearly dormant for almost two years under the Biden Administration.
- VA partnered with the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services to identify and recover [\\$106 million in duplicate billing](#).
- VA has brought tens of thousands of employees [back to the office](#), where VA can work better as a team to serve Veterans.
- VA has [terminated union contracts for most bargaining unit employees](#) and [redirected millions in wasteful union spending back to Veterans](#).
- VA [ended DEI at the department](#), reversing the divisive Biden-era policies and stopping more than \$14 million in DEI spending.
- VA is [phasing out treatment for gender dysphoria](#). Frankly, this commonsense reform should have been done years ago.


Some of the items that have been started by the VAC office this year:

Anonymously Grateful is a 501©(3) non-profit organization that honors fallen service members and their families. We are 100% volunteer organization that raises money for Gold Star families by selling merchandise, donations, and sponsorships. We announce our honorees in November, then fund raise thru September. The weekend of September 11th, we hold a big banquet where we bring in the families and friends, we feed them, entertain them, and then split everything we raise amongst the families.

We currently are honoring 3 families. 2 KIAs and 1 who lost his battle to PTSD. Our first KIA with SGT Seth Garceau of the Iowa Army National Guard who was hit by an IED in Iraq on February 27th, 2005. He later passed away to those injuries in Germany on March 4th, 2005. Our second KIA is PFC Phillip Pannier of the US Army who was killed in combat during Operation Iraq Freedom on January 8th, 2008. Finally, our mental health honoree is PFC Tristian Hughes of the USMC. He died unexpectedly at Camp Lejeune on April 19, 2025

This year's banquet will be held on September 11th 2026 in the Redstone Room in downtown Davenport. We will have a special guest speaker, Kris Paronto who is a former US Army Ranger and part of the 2012 Benghazi attack. He consulted on the movie 13 Hours which is based on those attacks.



