Dear Registered Voter,

Illinois now offers Permanent Vote By Mail. By applying for this status, the voter is automatically mailed a ballot prior to each election. This would allow voters to receive an official ballot for each general and/or primary election without having to apply each time. You may apply to permanently be placed on Vote By Mail status using the attached application. A voter remains in a permanent status until the voter requests to be removed, changes registration information (i.e., new address, name change), or registers to vote in another county.

Voters who choose to Vote By Mail can mail back their ballot in the postage pre-paid envelope provided with the ballot, or they can use our secure Ballot Drop Box located in front of the County Clerk's Office at 1504 3rd Avenue, Rock Island, IL.
